

5. Sömsø. "Stützpunkt 1". A pillbox, camouflaged by trees growing on top, living quarters for the personnel of three "Ringstände" (circular M.G. emplacements of concrete - See Det. Sketch No. 41. App.A.) A slit trench connects the "Ringstände" with the pillbox.
6. "Stützpunkt Schwarzes Haug". One pillbox and one black house, with three "Ringstände".
7. "Stützpunkt 2". Two pillboxes, living quarters for the personnel of three "Ringstände" and one "Sektorstand" (arc-shaped M.G. position).
8. Four or five Flak "Vierlinge" (778856).
9. Pillbox with a steel cupola with three slits for M.G. fire towards the sea only. "Kompaniegefechtstand".
10. Concrete pillbox, living quarters for the personnel of Nos. 4 and 13.
11. Barbed wire.
12. Pillbox used as telephone exchange. Connections with the main military telephone net and underground cables to all strongpoints.
13. 5 cm. KVK in an open concrete emplacement with an adjoining "Ringstand" for M.G. Nos. 4, 10 and 13 are together known as "Stützpunkt 3".
14. 3 light A.A. 772852.
15. Pillbox with a "Ringstand" outside.
16. Big pillbox with a fixed steel cupola with 6 slits for M.G. fire in all directions ("Sechs-schattenturm"). The walls are reinforced 1.5 m. thick, and the pillbox is divided into two rooms, one for living quarters and one smaller with access to the cupola, which serves as a fighting compartment. Outside the bunker a "Ringstand" for flak purposes.
17. 5 cm. KVK in open concrete position and 3 light A.A. 774839.
18. Heavy S/L.
19. Ölbr, six 88 mm. A.A. at 753831.

The whole shore of Sola Bay has been mined and is protected by barbed wire.

SOLA SEA.

1. Grunnberget, 3 light A.A., 778865.
2. Sola. 3 light A.A. and a dummy 4 gun heavy A.A. battery, 782857.
3. Sömsø. Bomb and ammunition dumps for Sola Seaplane St.
4. ammunition dump. 3 light A.A. and a light S/L.

6. 3 light A.A. on a knoll just north of the hangar.
7. Sömske husmorskole. Barracks for personnel of Sola Sea.
8. Barrack.
9. 3 light A.A., one light S/L at Grid 797860.
10. Joca. Water reservoir for Sola Sea. 500 m³, made of reinforced concrete. The reservoir is fed through a 12" pipe line from the main reservoir at Stangeland (Gisketjern, B33802) see No. 37.

SOLA LAND.

1. Pillbox, probably a sort of command post.
2. Aason (809852) 6 heavy A.A. poss. D.P., 3 "Ringstände" (see No. 5) and a small pillbox (Det. Sketch No. 41 App.C.).
3. Ca. 150 Russian and Polish P.O.'s.
4. Three petrol tanks underground.
5. Main ammunition and bomb dump of Sola and Forus. Primarily heavy A.A. ammunition and bombs of all calibres.
6. Skarberg. 3 light A.A., 801841.
7. Skadberg mountain. H.Q. of the Kommando Flughafenbereich 22/III, Stavanger, Abt. Ia, Operations. The big barrack hut to the north of the way at 804841 contains the offices of the C.O. In the knoll to the south of the way is a pillbox, 25 x 15 m. used as a command centre with wireless and telephone exchange. To the north-west of the pillbox a "Ringstand".
8. Sema, 3 light A.A. at Grid 804834.
9. 12" wooden pipeline for the water supply to Sola A/P. The pipeline comes from Gisketjern, Stangeland by Sandnes where the main basin for the water supply of both Sola and Forus A/P's is situated at 801834. The basin is sunk into the earth and covered with turf, built of concrete with 30 cm. thick walls. The roof is 15 cm. concrete. The pumphouse is built into the western end of the whole structure. The basin is fed through a 12" iron pressure pipeline from the Grina Lake (9282), laid through a tunnel, 2 x 1.8 m. and 300 m. long, down from the mountain to the road at Latsi Lake (Grid 9183). The weak point of the tunnel is the so-called "Ventil chamber", a vertical pit 45 m. from the intake to Grina Lake.
10. 3 light A.A., 3 light S/L. 777833.
11. Raego. 6 heavy A.A. now reported to be dummies. 774824.
12. Stangeland in Sola. 3 light A.A.
13. Stangeland in Sola. 12 heavy A.A. at 793822, poss. D.P.
14. Gjure east. L". hospital barracks with living quarters for the med. sec. personnel.

15. All along the road from Soma to Stangeland a great many barracks for the ground personnel of Sola A/F have been built. Numerous petrol barrels in dumps of about 15 with a distance of about 50 m. between each dump have been laid out on both sides of the roads leading from Soma in both directions.

FORUS A/F.

1. Røyneberg. 3 light A.A. 818859.
2. 3 light A.A. 821860.
3. Ammunition dump. Infantry and light A.A. ammunition.
4. 3 light A.A. 840865.
5. Jaatten. W/T and A.O.P. on the top of the knoll. Ammunition dump on the northern slope. The radio masts are reported to have been taken down this autumn, but this report has not been confirmed.
6. Flugleitung Forus. 3 light A.A. 828856, one pillbox used as command centre equipped with W/T and telephone and 4 M.G.'s, one pillbox used as shelter and an open M.G. nest
7. 3 light A.A. 822848.
8. 3 light A.A. 835843.
9. Ulaberget. 2 light A.A.
10. The main draining canal for the A/F area. The whole A/F is built on the bottom of a lake, which was drained out several years before the war. The ground is therefore extremely boggy, and extensive draining was necessary. The original draining canal leads through a tunnel under Aasen to the Hafrefjord opposite the Seaplane base, but that was not enough to make the site usable as an A/F, and the Germans therefore, in 1940, had to undertake the construction of a new canal to the Gannsfjord. This was a very difficult task, the canal just west and east of the road-crossing passing through quicksands and marshes, so that it repeatedly caved in. It is said, that the work was only made possible through the long spell of dry weather during the summer and autumn of 1940.
11. Barracks, living quarters of the ground personnel of the A/F.
12. Petrol tanks camouflaged as a red-painted house some 100 m. south of the railway st.
13. 4 large barrack huts used as a potato store. Probably the main potato store of the Germans in Vest-Troms, Norway.
14. 6 heavy A.A. 849834.
15. Barracks, living quarters for the Flak personnel of the A/F.

16. Some large sheds, intended as garages for some 15 Hotchkiss tanks, now stationed at Klepp, Jaeren. The sheds are now used as garages for motor trucks and lorries. Together with these sheds are some barracks for the personnel.
17. Stokka school, requisitioned for the use of one troop of field artillery, four 15 cm. guns.
18. Hølen. 2 light A.A., one S/L.
19. 3 light A.A. 839825.
20. Lura. Some kind of store, a number of small huts. Details unknown. Also a pillbox with M.G. slits.
21. Lurehammeren. D/F and small W/T station.
22. Holensvin, en. Three pillboxes covering the road-junction.
23. Wooden pipe-line for the water supply of Forus A/P. For details see No. 37.
24. Scna. 822818. 6 heavy A.A. Shelters dug into the knoll.
25. Ca. 50 Russian P.O.W. billeted in the old school.
